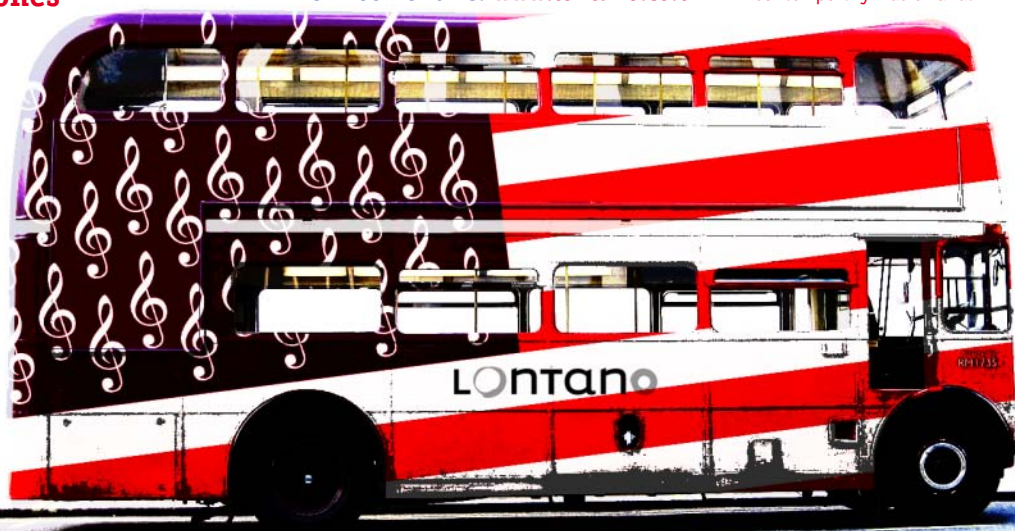

In 1992, Lontano turned its energies towards recording and its label LORELT has since acquired the same reputation for versatility, eclecticism and vision enjoyed by Lontano itself. ## The Second London Festival of American Music – In Celebration of John Harbison’s 70th Anniversary

Lontano’s Biennial Festival features American composers that are, in most cases, very well known in the States but little known in England and Europe.

The composers and pieces reflect the diversity of style characteristic of new music in America today, as well as diversity of gender, generation and geography. The festival will celebrate John Harbison’s 70th Anniversary by featuring his choral and chamber music. Deans of American music such as Amy Beach will be performed alongside leading composers of differing generations: from Peter Child and Steve Mackey to Orlando Jacinto Garcia and Barbara White to emerging composers such as Daniel Thomas Davis, Kay Rhie and Jason Eckhard. The festival will also include the world premiere of a new work written especially for the occasion by New York composer Marjorie Merryman. Most of the works in this festival are British and European premieres.

Lontano is pleased to welcome the BBC Singers who will be joining them in their opening concert and virtuoso saxophonist Timothy McAllister.
